
Watching their determination and seeing their successes, both big and small, was the most rewarding part of the month.

NEWS FROM LEYTON CHILDREN'S HOME

Here at Ambleside, we have been busy celebrating the season with various events, including the staff Christmas party, Young People's Volunteers Day, and fulfilling Wish List experiences.

Wish List Experiences

For the Wish List experiences, we helped young people enjoy their dream activities, from visiting Winter Wonderland to driving luxury cars. One young person even had the chance to drive a Porsche and Lamborghini with an instructor! Others enjoyed outings like the Ugly Duckling Panto at the Circus, Shrek Adventure, the Pinocchio Panto at Stratford Theatre, the London Eye, and Hyde Park's Winter Wonderland.

We really made the most of the festive period and the children got to experience some wonderful activities and adventures!

Community

Intergenerational Session at Aspray House: In the spirit of community, we held an intergenerational session at Aspray House, a nursing care home for older adults with varying needs. The session, called "Bridging the Gap," encouraged connection between generations through shared activities. Our children and young people baked brownies and decorated cakes to present to the residents, and in return, Aspray House provided arts and crafts materials and gifted hand-knitted teddies. Everyone enjoyed the experience, and we look forward to continuing these sessions in the New Year. It was a wonderful experience for all involved and it was a privilege to spend time with the residents of Asprey House.

Local Christmas Events
